THE FIRST READING

Jeremiah 23:1-6

THE SECOND READING

Ephesians 2:11-22

Remember that at one time you Gentiles by birth, called “the uncircumcision” by those who are called “the circumcision” —a physical circumcision made in the flesh by human hands— remember that you were at that time without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us. He has abolished the law with its commandments and ordinances, that he might create in himself one new humanity in place of the two, thus making peace, and

might reconcile both groups to God in one body through the cross, thus putting to death that hostility through it. So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; for through him both of us have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God.

Your vestry had its retreat last Saturday — the first since before my arrival in September 2019. The Rev. Canon Dena Cleaver-Bartholomew, the Canon to the Ordinary of the Diocese (like the bishop’s chief of staff) facilitated, and we “retreated” to the Guild Room at Emmanuel, staying home instead of going to a different location. Our familiar surroundings in our stay-at-home retreat gave us the opportunity to see our church building, and our community, in new ways. Not one but *two* really fine Yamaha grand pianos were delivered, placed, and tuned for Newport Music Festival concerts at Emmanuel while we met Saturday, and our delicious lunch was prepared in the newly renovated Emmanuel kitchen by our kitchen tenant and parishioner Annie Guinan of Sea Salt Provisions. These moments showed us that Emmanuel’s long traditions of warm welcome and community engagement have been both reinforced and deepened. We have opened our doors wider, and invited more of the community in.

In all of this, we have our project cut out for us as a vestry and as a congregation. We thought hard and prayerfully about those areas of our life together that are essential to our community and focused on five major areas, in order of priority: worship, outreach, stewardship, and the combined fourth priority of management/building and grounds. We also counted up how many clergy, staff, and volunteer hours it takes to support those priorities, so that we could make faithful choices about our stewardship of our whole community’s gifts of time and talent. Fun fact: one element in the worship category — the preparation of the bulletin — takes no fewer than 6-7 hours of combined time each week. These time allocations will help us to make informed choices in our approach to the ministry we share. Over the next weeks, the vestry will use this information to develop the plan for our shared ministry, and the roles each of us will take.

As we approach the first anniversary of my call as Emmanuel’s rector, we are now able to plan the celebration of new ministry that we couldn’t schedule during COVID restrictions. Bishop Kinsley will preside at the service at 6:00 pm on Thursday, September 16, 2021 to help the Emmanuel community celebrate this important moment in our shared ministry, along with my family and other friends. It is my honor and faithful privilege to serve as your rector, and I look forward to our next chapters together.
