

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Stephen gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. THE SECOND READING

Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation— if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good. Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture:

"See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame." To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner", and "A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall."

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do. But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

THE HOLY GOSPEL

Priest The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesus said, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. And you know the way to the place where I am going." Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, you will know my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him."

Philip said to him, "Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied." Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it."

There, anchored safe, my weary soul shall find eternal rest;





This Sunday's Music... is inspired by the Coronation of King Charles II and Queen Camilla yesterday in Westminster Abbey. You may notice that the first hymn is sung to the hymn tune Westminster Abbey. The prelude is Nimrod, and the postlude is Crown Imperial, both part of the prelude for Queen Elizabeth II's coronation. At the sequence is one of King Charles III's favorites, the Irish hymn Be Thou My Vision. The closing hymn is sung to the famous Welsh hymn tune CWM Rhondda, to honor King Charles' years as Prince of Wales. In contrast, our anthem is a new arrangement of an American folk hymn with text by Isaac Watts based on today's Gospel selection, and written this week by Randy for our musicians' circle. It was inspired by a recording of the hymn by the late American actor Andy Griffith of TV sheriff and attorney fame.

Next Sunday... we will have music related to our readings as always, and with a nod to the graduation on May 21 of our three seniors from Salve Regina University. And ironically, next week's postlude, Pomp and Circumstance March No. 1, so often played at graduation, was also played at the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II. The choir will sing a recent setting of Walt Whitman's poem The Road Less Traveled, a text often used in commencement ceremonies. Our artist in residence, Ali Hosford, will sing You'll Never Walk Alone from Carousel, as well, which is certainly our wish for Olivia, Bailey and Nellie as they reach this wonderful milestone in their lives. Hopefully you can make it to the Potluck supper this Wednesday where Randy will be joined by Nellie, Ali, Olivia and Bailey to entertain.
