

THE FIRST READING

Moses came down from Mount Sinai. As he came down from the mountain with the two tablets of the covenant in his hand, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, the skin of his face was shining, and they were

afraid to come near him. But Moses called to them; and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses spoke with them. Afterward all the Israelites came near, and he gave them in commandment all that the Lord had spoken with him on Mount Sinai. When Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil on his face; but whenever Moses went in before the Lord to speak with him, he would take the veil off, until he came out; and when he came out, and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, the Israelites would see the face of Moses, that the skin of his face was shining; and Moses would put the veil on his face again, until he went in to speak with him.

THE SECOND READING

I think it right, as long as I am in this body, to refresh your memory, since I know that my death will come soon, as indeed our Lord Jesus Christ has made clear to me. And I will make every effort so that after my departure you may be able at any time to recall these things.

For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God. *-2 Peter 1:13-21*

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. The First of the Month is here again. As is Emmanuel Church's custom, all "loose plate offerings" (those not already designated as a pledge) go to the Rector's Discretionary Fund to aid those in need.

Today is the Feast of the Transfiguration – celebrating the strange and wonderful moment when, for a few moments, three of Jesus' disciples caught a glimpse of Jesus in his heavenly glory. One of the intriguing aspects of the story is how the disciples react to this experience. We'll explore this as usual through liturgy and preaching, and also at the 9:00 am Bible study. But for the month of August, we are going to try out another way of exploring our responses to the scripture, with a prayer installation.

A cairn is a familiar sight to anyone who regularly goes walking, especially on pilgrimages. A cairn is a mound of stones, built by every passer-by adding a stone of their own. The stone can very simply be a marker that says 'I was here', almost like signing a visitors' book. It can be placed more like a silent prayer, a note of a personal resolution or a request to God to walk with you on the next leg of the journey. And it is always a reminder that – wherever we walk – we are part of a larger human community. Others have walked here before me, and more will follow on later.

Our regular Sunday worship at Emmanuel has a great many words, sung and spoken, but not so many moments of quiet reflection. By adding a prayer cairn this month, we can begin to add some threads to our worship that give room for silence, contemplation and wonder. The feast of the transfiguration, and the experience of the disciples on the mountain top, is a perfect moment to explore this. I hope to see you on Sunday – online or in person – to find out more!
