

THE ADVENT WREATH

A treasured way in our Episcopal tradition to mark our progress during Advent as we wait for God's light to break through the darkness with Jesus' birth. While the Advent wreath is a tradition that originated in families, and is not part of our worship liturgies, it is a lovely tradition to remember at the start of worship as we light candles for hope, peace, joy, and love. The four candles do not have any specific meaning within The Episcopal Church, but the themes of hope, peace, joy, and love are perfect for Advent, with joy on the third Sunday — Gaudete Sunday — represented by the pink candle. For churches that observe Advent with the liturgical color purple, the pink represents a lift in the observance of Advent as a semi-penitential season, or mini-Lent. In contrast, many Episcopal churches use Sarum blue vestments and altar hangings during Advent, which distinguishes the unique features of hopeful waiting in Advent over the penitence of Lent as we wait for God to come in human flesh. Today we light the first, second, third, and fourth candles of the Advent wreath. The first candle is for HOPE, the second candle is for PEACE, the third candle is for JOY, and the fourth candle is for LOVE.

THE SECOND READING

THE NICENE CREED, recited together, standing

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. 




And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say, we are bold to say:
